

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER
Monitoring Requirements Not Met for Grand Traverse Band Peshawbestown

Our water system violated a drinking water standards over the past year. Even though these were not emergencies, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened and what we did to correct these situations.

*We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not our drinking water meets health standards. During 2019 we did monitor and/or test for **Nitrates**. The sample results did not get to the correct person at the EPA which triggered a violation. The violation has been corrected, however, a public notice is still required.*

What should I do?

There is nothing you need to do at this time.

The table below lists the contaminant(s) we did properly test for during the last year and compliance period, how often we are supposed to sample for Nitrates and how many samples we are supposed to take, how many samples we took, when samples should have been taken, and the date on which follow-up samples were (or will be) taken.

Contaminant	Required sampling frequency	Number of samples taken	When all samples should have been taken	When samples were or will be taken
Nitrate	Annual	1	2019	2019 and 2020

What happened? What is being done?

After sampling for Nitrates, the sample results were sent to the wrong person at the EPA. The results were later sent to the correct person and are now on file. No limit of Nitrates were exceeded.
