IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER Monitoring Requirements Not Met for Grand Traverse Band East Bay Water Works

Our water system violated one drinking water standards over the past year. Even though these were not emergencies, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened and what we did to correct these situations.

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not our drinking water meets health standards. During 2019 we did not monitor and/or test for **Inorganic Contaminants (IOCs)** in the 2017-2019 compliance period and therefore cannot be sure of the quality of our drinking water during that time.

What should I do?

There is nothing you need to do at this time.

The table below lists the contaminant(s) we did not properly test for during the last year and compliance period, how often we are supposed to sample for IOCs and how many samples we are supposed to take, how many samples we took, when samples should have been taken, and the date on which follow-up samples were (or will be) taken.

What happened? What is being done?

It is the intent of the GTB DPW to sample for the IOC's during the month of July 2020. If any IOC contaminant is present above EPA standards, we will be sending out notification by mail and online.
